Most of you likely know, Mom, aka Wanda, fell and broke her left hip on May 22nd. She had surgery to repair it that same evening. It was a hairline fracture so they were able to put in pins instead of replacing the whole hip. She is so resilient! She heals so quickly it seems unreal. At any rate after the hospital she entered a rehabilitation facility and spent several weeks in physical therapy. I went every day I could and supervised her lunch and attended the rehab sessions. I learned quite a bit and helped brow beat her into cooperating. Marolyn stopped in to visit her for at dinner time every week day after work. (Marolyn is still working at Sonitrol Pacific.) We became well known at the care center because most of them wondered who was who!

On August 14th we finally brought mom home with us. In the mean time we arranged to put her on Medicaid and rearranged the house with safety in mind. We also purchased some things to help with her care. I think we may have over done it but the best buys were the bed and chair alarms. She can't move without our knowing it! We also now have home health coming in most days. The most valuable help is the in-home care arranged by the County and the physical therapist arranged by the Doctor. Home health will only last a few weeks but the in-home care will be permanent. We will have inhome care three days a week which will free William and I up to do other things like shop. We may even be able to arrange a visit to the beach. That will be a welcome respite.

Wannetta, Bill and Jeanetta came to visit over Independence Day. We had a good time. Netta and Bill are in Houston, Texas this Labor Day week end. That is where Seliena and her family live now. Of course the big draw is the grand babies, Brantley and Adelyn! Carson City is still where Netta and family live.
