HISTORY OF OUR COAT OF ARMS

The Dexter Coat of Arms was designed by Uncle Andy and included everyone who attended reunions. We had our first T-shirts in July 1992, and in 1994 each branch of the family declared a family color. Pete Fowler had the flag that we hang at every reunion made using the coat of arms. Find a description of the symbols below.

The DEXTER shield was created to represent our family's heritage since the marriage of Vernon Orin Dexter and Hannah Rose DeGraw

The rose was selected as the family flower in honor of Hannah "Rose." The yellow rose was her favorite

The theatrical mask represents our great sense of humor, constant jesting and appreciation of the arts.

The wheel represents our strong ties to mechanical equipment, including automobiles, trucks, trains, airplanes, construction and farming. Most of us are skilled laborers The yellow ribbon reminds us that no matter where we may wander, the family will have a "Yellow Ribbon Around the Old Oak Tree" to welcome us home.

The eagle symbolizes our patriotism and service to our country in the military. civil service and community volunteer programs.

The book symbolizes our interest in education, religious convictions, and relaxation reading

1917 was the year that Vernon Orin Dexter and Hannah Rose DeGraw were married and from that union the DEXTER family, as we know it, had its beginning.
